Story Elements

Some list the title, setting, characters, the problem, the solution and the moral or theme of the story. Some list a complex chain of events that summarize all key elements of the story, in chronological order.

Reading Worksheets

Explain that setting is when and where the story takes place. Write "when & where" in the section labeled setting, then have students describe the setting (i.e., a house made of candy, in the woods). Repeat with problem (the conflict that the character(s) face) and solution (the resolution to the problem).
